

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SIGMOIDOSCOPY

What is a sigmoidoscopy?

A sigmoidoscopy is an examination of your rectum and the first part of your sigmoid colon (lower intestine) with a flexible tube.

How do I prepare for the procedure?

- If you did not discuss instructions with your Primary Care Provider regarding **Coumadin (Warfarin), Dabigatran (Pradaxa), Aspirin 325mg, Ticlid (Ticlopidine), Plavix (Clopidogrel) or Enoxaparin (Lovenox)** please contact your Primary Care Provider for additional instructions.
- If you take **Iron (Ferrous Sulfate)** stop this **7 days** prior to the procedure.
- Starting **3 days before** the procedure:
 - Do not take **Motrin, Advil, Ibuprofen, Aleve or Naproxen.**
 - Stop eating foods which contain seeds or nuts, including popcorn, tomatoes, berries, poppy seeds, sesame seeds, and multigrain breads. No raw vegetables.

The day before the procedure:

- Drink clear liquids to avoid dehydration throughout the day.
- **Clear liquids include:** water, soda, tea, black coffee, clear broth, bouillon, apple juice, white grape juice, jello, lemonade, and gatorade.
- No solid food, red-colored liquids, dairy, tomato juice, orange juice, or protein shakes.
- IF you are on Insulin, check your blood sugar at least 4 times during the day.
Take ½ your usual evening dose on the night prior to the procedure.
- **At 5 PM:** Drink 10 oz. Magnesium citrate (VA pharmacy will mail it to you or you can purchase it over the counter). Then drink six glasses of water.
- Do NOT eat or drink anything after midnight.

The day of the procedure:

- If you are diabetic, check your blood sugar before leaving home.
- IF you take insulin, hold your insulin until after the procedure.
- IF you take diabetic pills, hold them until after the procedure.
- Take one "Fleet" enema two hours before the time your test is scheduled (VA Pharmacy will mail it to you or you can purchase it over the counter).
- Take your medications (except as above) with sips of water.
- Report to Bldg. 62, 4th Floor, GI Endoscopy.

What happens during the procedure?

- Your doctor will put air into the colon and this may feel like "gas pain". Your doctor may take a biopsy or remove a polyp. This does not cause any pain or discomfort.

What happens after the procedure?

- You will be able to go home, return to usual activities and eat your normal diet.

What if I have a problem after the procedure?

- If you have bad stomach pain, fever or bleeding: Call between 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM the GI Endoscopy Unit at (925) 373-4700 x35325. From 4:00 PM to 8:00AM, call (925) 373-4700 and ask the VA operator to page the GI doctor on call.
